See the beauty of Houmas House, known in its heyday as “The Sugar Palace,” a well-established plantation producing sugar by the time of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803.

Explore “The Myrtles – America’s Most Haunted House” and the beautifully restored Butler Greenwood Plantation. Then walk through St. Francisville, enjoying its charming churches, antique stores, and historic buildings

Natchez, MS

Day 04 Be amazed by one of the oldest cities on the Mississippi, founded in 1716. See antebellum and Victorian structures that sit high on a bluff. Explore the historical Frogmore Plantation and its rare cotton gin.

Vicksburg

Day 05 Explore sprawling Vicksburg National Military Park, with its battlefields, statues, and monuments to soldiers from both the North and South. A moving experience
